1) Welcome/Announcements/Roll Call Chief Johnson called the meeting to order at 4:01pm. Announcements	
 Chief Johnson – SB1057 is moving through the Senate. If passed, it will change the makeup of JJCC membership. 	
 Chief Johnson – Juvenile Facilities passed the BSCC targeted inspection August 13-14. 	
 Chief Johnson – Chief Deputy Carrie Vredenburgh and the JF Housing Managers will attend training in Florida for best practices for Juvenile Facilities. 	
 Stefanie Rodriguez – First day of school today. Valerie Salazar – Resource and Job Fair for Teens & TAY in the county to be held at Oxnard High School on 10/20/24, in recognition of Youth Justice Action Month. 	
2) Approval of the JJCC Meeting Minutes Dated April 17, 2024.	
Motion to approve minutes as submitted. Moved by Kevin Drescher; seconded by Steve Jenkins. All in favor. Motion approved.	
3) Public Comments None.	
4) Role of the JJCC and Responsibilities of Committee Members	
Chief Johnson reviewed various portions of the Bylaws:	
Agenda items will no longer be solicited. Members wishing to provide	
input shall contact the Chair no later than one week prior to the scheduled meeting.	
 Discussed the purpose of the JJCC, who the members are, and their responsibilities. 	
 Membership could expand with the addition of up to three school districts. Five districts have expressed interest as non-permanent members. 	
 In addition to the permanent member CBO, up to two non-permanent CBOs may be recommended by the Ad Hoc Subcommittee. 	
Discussed the purpose of various Subcommittees.	
Valerie Salazar reiterated that JJCPA funding is available to fund programs and services for all Ventura County youth, not only justice-involved youth.	
5) Ad Hoc Subcommittee Update – Recommendation for Community- Based Organization (CBO) representative(s)	
Presentation by Ad Hoc Subcommittee Lead Michael Rodriguez:	
Went over the JJCC CBO application process (draft).	
 Will submit proposal at October or December JJCC meeting. 	
Discussion ensued on how to reach out to possible CBOs. The CBO	
application is hosted on the Probation website, but outreach hasn't been discussed.	
Michael to request guidance on how to solicit possible CBOs.

6) Juvenile Justice Realignment Block Grant Plan Update and Planning	
Subcommittee for Realigned Youth	
Chief Johnson gave an update, reviewed, and summarized what has been	
discussed the last couple meetings.	
AB 505, which became effective 1/1/2024, modified the requirements of the	
JJRBG Subcommittee meeting schedule and approval of the plan. Office of	
Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR) had acknowledged some counties	
may not be able to facilitate the new requirements by the 5/1 deadline. Our	
plan was submitted by the May 1st deadline noting the JJRBG Subcommittee was not solidified and therefore did not approve the plan. Ventura was granted	
an extension until 9/30 to revise and resubmit.	
Chief Johnson reached out to the three previous Community Members; two are	
committed, one is unable. Request was sent to Supervisor Lopez for a	
Community Member recommendation to fill the third spot. No update at this	
time.	
Members volunteered or will have an agency representative attend: Cheryl	
Fox, Behavioral Health; Judge Romero, Juvenile Court; Michael Rodriguez,	
Public Defender; Kevin Drescher, District Attorney; Leticia Morales, HSA; and	
Dr. Consuelo Williams, VCOE. Community Members: Dwight Thompson, Sal	
Flores. Meeting to be scheduled.	
7) YES Update	
Presentation by Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion – Kate English and	
Lucas Saucedo:	
Youth Equity Initiative 2023-24 FY: Slide presentation showed how JJCC	
funding has been utilized.	
Summary of work on capacity building, collaborative connections, and	
centering youth voice. YEI offers free consultation and is currently working	
with the Youth Advisory Councils. YES Collaborative Update – Focus is on community-based solutions, for	
example, the Evening Reporting Center (ERC), LIFT, and Risk Assessment	
Instrument. A task force is researching options for emergency housing. YES is	
committed to youth, their decision making, and sharing power.	
Annual Youth Event – Youth Equity Summit 2024 – Took place at Ventura	
College, 140 attendees. Next will be in March 2025, and will have youth be	
involved in planning, budgeting, etc.	
Surveys indicate youth want housing, more indigenous-informed practices, and	
services for mental health and wellness.	
Training: 11/12/24 – Learning Lab Series #1, 9am-2pm at Williams BH	
Training Room. Register before 10/1/24.	
Dr. Williams applauded their accomplishments and offered VCOE as a partner	
and conduit in their efforts.
