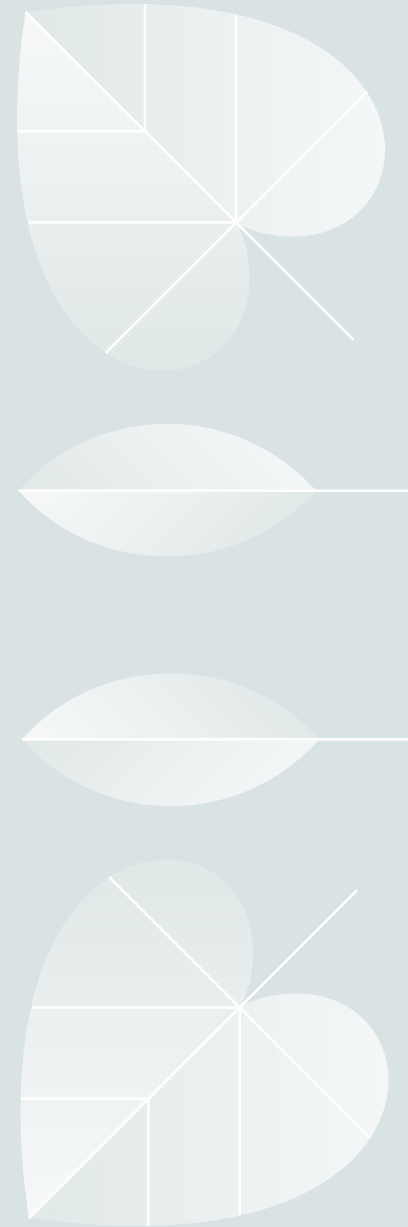

PLAN & APPROACH

- **Orientation & Assessments:** Our primary objective is to assess strengths, risks, and needs. We use the results of the assessments to develop Treatment Plans for youth and their families. We use the results of the assessments to develop treatment goals.
- ❖ **Treatment:** This phase structured and may include of a combination of group and/or individual therapy, family counseling and Responsible Adult training. Depending on their progress in treatment they may transition to aftercare/maintenance.
 - In the Juvenile facility, clients are seen for treatment and eventually enter a transitional pre-release phase.
- ❖ **Responsible Adult:** Is a multiple week curriculum developed to provide education & support to an adult in the client's life, responsible for identifying risky behaviors and situations, so the client can remain safely in the community. This training helps the selected individual, approved by Probation, to develop the skills and knowledge needed to successfully perform this service.

CURRICULUM

Pathways

The curriculum we utilize is the Pathways workbook by Timothy J. Kahn.

Worksheets

The Pathways workbook provides worksheets for the client to complete while they are in treatment. We also have work sheets specifically created by our clinicians to help clients develop the skills, interventions and knowledge to change their problematic behavior.

OUTCOMES & DATA



CASOMB Guidelines For Youth

Per CASOMB and their research, data shows that nonsexual recidivism is approximately 10x higher than sexual recidivism.

Outcomes

It has been our experience that participating in our Collaborative Model for adolescents who have committed sexual offenses frequently results in clients remaining offense free in the community, reunification with families and success in school.

RA/Chaperone Program

After completing RA training, we saw 5 clients supported by trained adults participate successfully in family outings and events.



CONCLUSION

Our Collaborative Model for adolescents with sexual behavior problems follows the guidelines and best practices developed by the Association for the Prevention and Treatment of Sexual Abuse (ATSA) and the California Sex Offender Management Board (CASOMB).
