

Clients March 2025 to Present: 42





Out of These, 86% have successfully met or are on track to meet their goals

Program Context Note:

Educational Advocacy services experienced a temporary pause from October 2024 - April 2025 due to recruitment, hiring, required Probation background clearance, and specialized training. Full services resumed in March 2025.

Educational Advocate Assisted Families with:

- IEP Meetings
- Child/Family Therapy Meetings
- Administration Meetings
- Student Services Meetings



- *4 out of 10 clients assisted with enrollment had not been in school for a year*
- *EA advocated for 5 students to stay in their school*
